

CGTC Impact Report as of January 2010

Enrollment at Central Georgia Technical College continues to grow with 6,845 students currently attending winter quarter classes which resulted in a 21.7% increase over winter 2009. Fall quarter 2009 (2010-02) beginning enrollment was at an all time high of over 7,000 students and resulted in a 24.4% increase from Fall to Fall.

Enrollments have increased across each age group for Winter 2010-03:

CGTC's average age for its student population continues to encompass the 21 to 25 age group. The non-traditional age group of Over 40 is steadily increasing also as we see economic down turns occurring in CGTC's seven-county service area.

CGTC is continuously proving its value to the State of Georgia as it provides educational resources, for citizens in and surrounding its seven-county service area, which leads to the pursuit of skills and knowledge that result in great careers even in today's difficult economic times. CGTC offers a great education at a low tuition rate which makes getting a post-secondary education all the more affordable. Access to college tuition assistance and grant programs is made easy for students.

Annual tuition for a full load of courses at CGTC averages about \$2,244 including required fees. An average of 63.4% of students enrolled for Winter quarter received a Pell award and 71.1% received HOPE. Students receiving the Pell and HOPE awards have no debt after graduation.

CGTC offers 42 program groupings with over 233 degree, diploma and technical certificate programs available. Over 39% of students were enrolled in health programs this Winter quarter and hundreds more preparing themselves for careers ranging from computer technologies to more traditional skill areas like industrial systems, electronics, drafting, automotive technology and personal services areas such as cosmetology and criminal justice.
